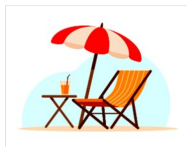

**The Sussex County Division of Health** reminds all residents: if a bat should get into your home, please call the Police Department. They will call animal control. Although every case differs, most bats in the home require testing. Please make sure to provide your name, address phone number when calling.

## Property Tax and Water/Sewer Information

Taxes are payable quarterly on the first day of February, May, August and November. Payments must be made on or before the due date to avoid interest charges.

Water/Sewer is billed mid month in March, June, September and December and is due within 30 days after the billing date. Should you have any questions or concerns regarding payment you may arrange to attend a meeting of the Board of Public Works before the due date by contacting the Collector (973-827-9230 ext. 4011).

Borough Ordinance CH 209-2 F: Bills and notices will be mailed through ordinary United States mail service and if not received, the consumer shall obtain them from the Water Department or an agent or employee thereof.

Failure to receive bills or notices shall not excuse nonpayment.

Having your house number, building letter or number visible from the street is important. It is essential, not just for people trying to find your home, but especially in case of an emergency. When responding to an emergency call, police officers, EMS and firefighters look for house numbers when they first arrive. Remember, these numbers could be a lifesaver in case of an emergency so you want to make sure you have them visible, large and in the right color! **If you have to call 911 please tell the 911 Operator your home number, building letter or number (if you have one).**

During the summer months the Road Department will only pick up **grass clippings**. Pickup is on Fridays only. Bags must be curbside by 7 A.M. We make one trip through town. Bags placed curbside after the truck has passed will remain until the next pickup date. Do not put bags in the gutter or road. Rain can make them break open and clog storm drains and lines. Bags found containing any rocks, dirt, dog waste or household garbage will not be picked up.

We also ask that all homeowners please refrain from blowing cut grass into public streets. It's important to keep the storm drains clear of debris.
