town. CURBSIDE PICKUP ONLY! Brush must be cut in lengths of no longer than 5 ft. Leaves must be placed in biodegradable bags. If we do not pick up your leaves and brush a notice will be left explaining why.

Water/Sewer Department News

You could miss out - The Borough has received a \$500,000 grant to replace galvanized and lead lines. The funds are available on a first come, first serve basis for homeowners who complete the survey.

The Borough is in the process of identifying what type of water service lines owners have entering their homes or businesses. Door tag surveys are being left on the doors of Borough residences. When you see the tag, please do not throw them out. Complete the survey and return it to Borough Hall. Our thanks to all those who have already completed this survey.
