Mayor Marino stated that the Borough is receiving \$4,400.00 from the State in grant money.

Mayor Marino and Councilman Kelly attended a dinner at the Lafayette House, honoring and recognizing mayors from the county sponsored by the Sussex County Economic Development Partnership. The mayors' picture along with brief facts about their town, how the budget cuts were affecting their towns were also presented. They had an enjoyable evening.

2. EMS Mutual Aid concerns

An article was published in the local newspaper about Vernon EMS covering Hamburg. Mayor Marino stated that towns have no formal coverage or agreements; they do respond to mutual aid calls and help each other out. Councilwoman Oehler, as the EMS Captain did respond with a Letter to the Editor explaining the situation.

2. POLICE COMMISSIONER

Monthly report for September 2010

3. BOARD OF HEALTH

The next meeting will be held on Tuesday October 12, 2010 at 6:30 PM.

COUNCILMAN KELLY:

1. BUILDING AND GROUNDS

Councilman Kelly presented a Landscaping Maintenance Contract for Orchard Street Extension, Municipal Park, Clock area, and Municipal Parking Lot from Farmside Landscape & Design. There were three (3) options to choose from, with Councilman Kelly recommending option #2, which included spring clean up: \$785.00, bi-weekly weed control: \$3050.00, and fall clean up / cutbacks: \$785.00, which comes to \$254.17 a month. Farmside will also do a general clean up with cutbacks for \$1575.00.

Motion by Councilman Kelly, seconded by Councilwoman Oehler to accept the landscaping maintenance contract from Farmside.

Councilman Krasnomowitz asked what does the bi-weekly entail; if it were a chemical weed spraying and if that was really necessary. He also asked about the beautification project with the volunteers and if we were going to proceed with that. Mayor Marino said that the beautification project can be in addition to this. Councilman Krasnomowitz suggested that we approve the fall clean up now and get additional information on the cost and chemicals. Councilman Kelly will contact them for that information.

Councilman Kelly withdrew the original motion.

Motion by Councilman Kelly, seconded by Councilwoman Oehler to accept the general cleanup and cutback contract from Farmside at a cost of \$1575.00. All in favor.

Councilman Kelly discusses with the Council the need for a maintenance agreement for the generators in town. He said that the road dept only does the oil changes to the generators and that all other things are done by calling in a contractor. He was going to speak with John Ruschke and Jerry Kastner about the idea.

Councilman Kelly stated that he received an advertisement from an electric company in which bills could be lowered by 11-20% a month. He was going to check into it.

COUNCILWOMAN OEHLER:

DRUG ALLIANCE

The Brownie Troop of Kathy Haig placed the pink ribbons around town for the month of October in recognition of Breast Cancer.

For the Senior Meeting, the pharmacist did attend to give a presentation, in which the seniors did enjoy very much.

RECREATION 2.

The Halloween Parade will be held on October 31st, beginning at 2 PM at the fire house, with the paraders marching behind the fire truck to the Hamburg School for goodie bags.

Councilwoman Oehler mentioned that the golf social was held in August with 28 golfers. The trip to the observatory in Franklin is on hold until the summer months. Chris Fitzpatrick has the following clinics scheduled at the Hamburg School: scrabble/chess, guitar, bongo drum, dance class, karate, drawing, arts and crafts, juggling, exercise, hula-hoop, and bike rodeo.

COUNCILMAN LAW:

FIRE DEPARTMENT / EMS

The Fire Dept. held the golf outing and marched in the County Parade and both were successes.

Councilman Law stated that the Judge and administrator requested a meeting with him.

RECYCLING 4.

Recycling with Hardyston is going well. This coming weekend, October 10th, the 8th grade class from Hamburg School will be doing a clean-up around town. Councilman Law invited all to attend.

The new recording software has been received.

CONSTRUCTION DEPARTMENT 2.

Construction Report August 1, 2010 - August 31, 2010

Councilmember Krasnomowitz advised that there were 15 permits issues, 0 certificates of occupancy, 17 certificates of approvals with a total of \$1961.00 collected in fees for the month of August. Councilman Krasnomowitz stated that in August of 2009 a total of \$4376.00 was collected and in August of 2010 a total of \$1961.00 has been collected, so activity has really declined.

LAND USE BOARD

Due to the Columbus Day Holiday, the Land Use Board will be meeting tomorrow, October 5th. The gas station proposal is not on the agenda until the November meeting, but the "Amazing Stoneworks" application and the rezoning of the property at the Gingerbread Castle is on the agenda.

BOARD OF EDUCATION

Councilman Barr spoke with the Board of Education regarding the OEM truck and they will purchase it for \$1.00.

Chief John Haig - with regards to the repair of the fire house - the adjuster from the insurance company did come to estimate the damage to the building and truck, so the estimate will be coming soon. There was a problem with the alarm system and no one knew the pass code on the fire system. Chief Haig did not have access into the building so he requested that he does. Council agreed and his key fob will be updated. He also inquired about a delinquent tax notice that he received. Borough Clerk explained that there was a mix-up with many mortgage companies and dates but everything should be straightened out by now.
