ENGINEERING:

1. Zinno Construction, LLC - Payment due of \$5,877.48

Zinno Construction would like to close out the contract and would like payment of \$5877.48. Mr. Ruschke stated that there are two issues to address - the grass and the punch list. The grass has improved greatly and is far enough along that we can approve that issue. Councilman Law asked about the grass by the drainage area on the hill by the parking lot and was told that it is a difficult area and, given the current weather conditions, the grass there is doing just fine. The second issue was the damage to the corner of one of the wooden fence rails. The contractor is insisting that the damage was not caused by him or his trucks and he does not have any responsibilities to vandalism issues. The Road Dept. is stating the same. The contractor is questioning the maintenance bond contract start date and feels that it should be at the substantial completion date which would be a June date. Mike ran the pump for several hours and found no issues with that. Council discussed the issuance of the maintenance bond and the date of it and it was determined that it should have a June date on it. Mr. Ruschke recommended paying the last payment and authorizing the maintenance bond dated back to late June, to when the project was substantially complete. Motion by Councilman Barr, seconded by Councilman Law to authorize the payment of \$5877.48 to Zinno Construction, LLC, and to authorize the maintenance bond dated late June. Roll Call:

2. Falcon Ridge

The project is substantially completed. Mr. Ruschke explained the problems with the pipe jacking and the cost issues.

3. Orchard Street Drainage - NJEIT

Mr. Ruschke stated that the work is completed for this year. The punch list items need to be addressed with the contractor, especially around the settling of the basins, before the snow-plowing begins. The paving is under the grant money and will probably wait until the spring for the settling to be done and it is getting close to when the asphalt plants close. Councilman Krasnomowitz asked when the contractor will be returning to address the items, as the quality of the work is poor. Mr. Ruschke will follow up on that and let the Council know.

4. Heritage Lakes - NJEIT

Mr. Ruschke said that the generator is on site but with all the water that we've been having, the contractor has had trouble digging the footing. As our current generator is having trouble, Mr. Ruschke is pushing the contractor to hurry along.

5. 2011 Paving

At the moment, this project in the DOT's hands for review. They wanted a road opening permit and are dragging their feet in reviewing the permit. Mr. Ruschke is putting pressure on the DOT. This project has to be awarded by August 2012 so time wise we are still ok. It may be a spring project instead of being done in the fall as asphalt plants will be closing soon.

6. Rt. 23 Water Main Replacement

The bid for the Rt. 23 water main replacement will be awarded on September 22nd and the work will be performed at night, according to the DOT mandate.

7. Infiltration / In-Flow

Mr. Ruschke explained to the Council that the flow through SCMUA has been close to 1 million gallons daily, attributing a lot of this to the rain from Hurricane Irene. The water has been so high and flooded in so many areas, (mentions behind Orchard Street) that the water has been going into the sewer system instead of just the storm drains, which means that gets sent to SCMUA, making those numbers go up so high.

Motion by Councilman Barr, seconded by Councilman Law to open the meeting to Road Dept. Foreman Mike Schneider. All in favor.

Members discuss the amount of water that was in the ball field of the Hamburg School and the retention area there, mentioning the incredible storm that Hurricane Irene was. Mayor Marino asked about putting in additional drainage in that area. Mr. Ruschke said that a drainage system cannot handle a 100 year storm like that, no matter how good of a system that it is. He will start to think about Hamilton Street and the Board of Education property retention basin after discussion about the amount of water that was in the area. But again, Mr. Ruschke stressed that any amount of additional drainage system could not handle the amount of water that was received from that storm. The problems with Falcon Ridge were mentioned. Mr. Ruschke will look into seeing what can be done in the area. Also, Mayor Marino wondered if anything could be done about the electric service

being able to be upgraded on Summit and Circle as they were the last in town to receive restoration. Councilman Barr stated that he was also out of electric service for over 30 hours.

Motion by Councilman Barr, seconded by Councilman Law to open to the public. All in favor.

Russ Brown – 3 Hamilton Street – thanked Chief John Haig of the Fire Dept. for his help. He said that he lost his washer and dryer and also his freezer. It seems that a retention basin over flows from Lawrence to Hamilton and goes into one catch basin. Mike Schneider said he removed brush and debris from the trench from behind the Brown's home. Mr. Ruschke will look at this and make recommendations to the Council.

Sheila Frayko said that nothing has been discussed lately at the Board of Education meetings about the Falcon Ridge drainage issues.

Patty Brown – said that this affected 5 couples in that area. Ms. Brown wondered why the drains in the road are never cleaned out, that might possibly help. Mr. Schneider said that once a year the drains are cleaned.

Karen VanOrden – 5 Hamilton Street – said this is the first time ever she has had water in her finished basement and now she has cracks in her floor that were never there before.

Mayor Marino said that there are a lot of contributing factors to this and will are willing to help. He also said that he is always willing to take phone calls.

Motion by Councilman Barr, seconded by Councilman Law to close to the public. All in favor.
