**2014 Shared Service Contract – Littell Community Center**

Mayor Marino presented the 2014 Shared Service Contract for the Littell Community Center, stating that he believed that the Borough should continue with the service to the residents as a lot of our residents are using it. Councilman Kelly was pleased to see the breakdown that was included with the contract and noted that more Hamburg seniors use it than Franklin and Hardyston seniors combined. Mayor Marino added that they also manage our fields and will be fixing them in the spring. The 2014 contract will have a \$1000.00 increase and the 2015 contract will reflect a \$2000.00 increase.

**1. FIRE DEPARTMENT / OEM**

**Highway Occupancy Permit – Hamburg Fire Department May 16<sup>th</sup>, 17<sup>th</sup>, and 18<sup>th</sup> 2014 and August 15<sup>th</sup>, 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> 2014 for Charitable Solicitation.**

Mayor Marino presented the application for the Charitable Solicitation for the Fire Department for May 16<sup>th</sup>, 17<sup>th</sup>, and 18<sup>th</sup> 2014 and August 15<sup>th</sup>, 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> 2014.

Motion by Councilman Krasnomowitz, seconded by Councilman Kelly to approve said application. All in favor.

**EMS Report for February 2014**

Motion by Councilman Garrett, seconded by Councilman Kelly to open to EMS Captain Joyce Oehler. All in favor.

Ms. Oehler gave the call report for the month of February – 32 calls including 9 mutual aid to Hardyston, 1 to Franklin and 1 to Lafayette; 7 trauma, 16 medical, 2 stand-bys, 5 fire, 1 MVA, and 1 transport.

Mayor Marino stated there were 25 fire calls with 165 man hours.

**2. POLICE COMMISSIONER**

Motion by Councilman Kelly, seconded by Councilman Sena to open to Police Director Wayne Yahm. All in favor.

**Monthly Report February 2014**

The February 2014 monthly report for the Police Department showed 570 calls of service, including 9 arrests, 18 motor vehicle accidents, and 48 motor vehicle summonses issued.

Mr. Yahm also mentions that from the report the Council can notice that a lot of training was done by the Officers and states that the majority of this training is done in house.

Director Yahm said that a prescription drop off will be held on April 28<sup>th</sup> from 10 AM – 2 PM at the Police Station. The last one that was held netted about 30-50 pounds of unwanted/expired prescription drugs.

Councilman Garrett questioned the amount of money that is being spent on fuel for the patrol cars, noting that it is 4-6 mpg per vehicle. Mr. Yahm replied that on the Officers patrol as much as possible and on cold days they do leave the cars run longer in case there is a call. They also do go out of county for training.

Motion by Councilman Kelly, seconded by Councilman Krasnomowitz to close to the Director. All in favor.

**Memorandum from Wayne Yahm regarding purchase of 2014 Ford Police Interceptor Utility Base Vehicle.**

Mayor Marino relayed that some of the money for the vehicle is coming from FEMA money. A patrol car is needed now and that taxes are not being raised to purchase this vehicle. Mayor Marino also stated that even after this vehicle is purchased, there will be approximately \$25,000.00 left in this account.

Motion by Councilman Garrett, seconded by Councilman Sena to purchase the patrol vehicle at an approximate cost of \$38,184.00.

Borough Historian Appointment – Marion Wood

Mayor Marino announced that Councilman Barr would like to officially name Dr. Marion Wood as Borough

Historian and she has met all the State criteria.

**WHEREAS**, the Legislature of the State of New Jersey has declared as a matter of public policy that each Municipality may participate to increase the education appreciation and communication of our heritage through local historians in such manner as to reflect the special character of specific historic or cultural development within the Municipality, in the interest of the recreation, education, inspiration and enrichment of the citizens of this State; and

**WHEREAS**, the local historians enabling act, N.J.S.A 40: 10A-1et.seq., provides that a Municipality may establish the position of Local Historian; and

**WHEREAS**, the Borough of Hamburg deems it advisable, necessary and in the public interest to establish the position of Local Historian;

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Hamburg, assembled in public session this 3rd day of March 2014 that the position of Local historian be an is hereby established for the Borough of Hamburg, and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, Dr. Marion Wood is hereby appointed as Local Historian to serve without compensation at the pleasure of the Mayor and Council.

Construction Activity Report 1/1/ 2014 – 1/31/ 2014

Councilmember Krasnomowitz advised that there were 14 permits issued, 1 certificates of occupancy, and 13 certificates of approvals with a total of \$2357.00 collected in fees for the month of January.

**4. INSURANCE**

Councilman Garrett asked about the insurance rider for the Littell Center, if the amount was sufficient, and Councilman Krasnomowitz answered that the Borough has a rider of over \$10 million.

**2. SANITATION AND RECYCLING**

Councilman Burd presented the agreement for the Borough of Hamburg and Sussex County Municipal Utilities Authority for Certified Recycling Professional (CRP).

Motion by Councilman Burd, seconded by Councilman Garrett to accept the agreement as presented. All in favor.

**3. GRANTS**

Councilman Burd said that he emailed all Council members the information regarding eCIVIS, a company that acts as a search engine for all grants available and upon agreement executed with town will forward same information on a daily basis, stating also that this company has been in place since the year 2000 and believes there is a lot of money out there for us to receive.

After a brief discussion, motion by Councilman Burd, seconded by Councilman Krasnomowitz to go with eCIVIS at a cost of \$495.00 per year for 3 years.

Mayor Marino asked if there were any matching funds involved and was answered no.

Councilman Garrett agreed that if the Borough could acquire some money from grants that he thought we

should try it, stating that all departments would be responsible to get their own grants.

**4. BOARD OF EDUCATION**

**COUNCILMAN KELLY**

**1. RECREATION**

Councilman Kelly said that Recreation did not request nor received any budget money in 2013 since they had a lot in their account and were spending it down. Now this year they were once again asking for the \$9500.00 so that they can run all their programs as they want to. Councilman Kelly announced the upcoming events: Family Fun Night, which is a 2 hour swim night at the YMCA, is scheduled for March 22; Breakfast with the Easter Bunny will be held on April 12<sup>th</sup>; the Miss Hamburg Contests will be held in June at the Hamburg School; and Summer Rec will run July 14-25 at the Fireman's Pavilion.

**2. COURT**

Councilman Kelly stated that information was received from the New Jersey Courts regarding Municipal Court Information Technology Improvements. They will be doing a lot of upgrades to the court hardware and software at no cost to towns.

**4. NEWSLETTER**

Information for 2014 Spring Newsletter is being compiled and Councilman Kelly said that any last minute information should be submitted as soon as possible.

**COUNCILMAN GARRETT**

**1. BUILDING AND GROUNDS**

**2014 Proposal from Farmside for Orchard Street, Route 23 Parking Lot and Clock Tower**

The Borough received the 2014 proposal from Farmside Landscape for the above Borough Properties for the spring and fall clean-up and bi-weekly weed control totaling \$4750.00. Councilman Garrett recommended that the Borough go with the above proposal as they do a terrific job on all areas stated above.

Motion by Councilman Garrett, seconded by Councilman Kelly to accept the 2014 Proposal from Farmside in the amount of \$4750.00.

Councilman Kelly said that they do a great job and also make the intersection look terrific.

**Municipal Sign**

Excavation for the sign will begin as soon as the weather breaks. The electricity and masonry will also be done. Papers submitted by Butler Signs included \$3200.00 for the footing so that was returned to the Borough.

**Meeting Room Ceiling**

Councilman Garrett said that he will have estimates on the sheetrock for the ceiling by the April meeting.

**Wallkill Ave Building**

The doors and heaters are in, and work will continue on the siding as weather permits.

**3. BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS**

**Kraft Power - Planned Service Proposal for Emergency Generating System Contract for 2014.**

This will be tabled until the April meeting so that the BPW can review the contract.

**COUNCILMAN SENA**

**1. FINANCE / TAX DEPARTMENT**

The Tax Collector's Report for January 2014 totaled \$462,716.64.

Motion by Councilman Sena, seconded by Councilman Garrett to accept the Resolution of the Hamburg Borough Council to redeem third party tax sale certificate #12-008 for Block 17 Lot 18 (C1909) in the amount of \$865.62. All in favor.

**2. ROAD DEPARTMENT**

Councilman Sena discussed with the Council a fuel situation and our account with Hardyston, who has, at times, been out of fuel. He stated that a few years back the Borough did have a secondary source and believes this would be beneficial to the Road Dept. Councilman Sena presented Resolution #2014-07, in which the Borough would use Region Oil as a secondary source for fuel when Hardyston is out of fuel. The following resolution was offered:

Resolution #2014-07

**WHEREAS** the Borough would be able to purchase diesel fuel when the Township of Hardyston pump station is unavailable to the Borough; and

**WHEREAS** the Borough would authorize the issuance of a Region Oil Commercial Account card with a maximum limit of purchases set at \$1,000;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the council of the Borough of Hamburg authorization is granted for the issuance of a Region Oil Commercial Account Card with a \$1,000 limit issued to Michael Schneider (Road/BPW foreman).

Motion by Councilman Sena, seconded by Councilman Burd to accept the resolution as offered.

**DISCUSSION**

Councilman Garrett asked if the Borough would be paying taxes on this fuel and Councilman Sena was not sure.

All in favor.

Motion by Councilman Sena, seconded by Councilman Garrett to open the meeting to Road Dept. Mike Schneider. All in favor.

Mr. Schneider reported that he has been out of salt, like most of the County and State, using grits to put on the roads after the department plows. The workers in his dept. are doing fine. Mayor Marino asked at what point Mr. Schneider will not buy any more salt, or even consider looking for salt? Mr. Schneider replied that if and when he finds salt, he will buy it and if he does not need to use it, then he will have a jump-start on next year. He started this year with 250 tons and bought an additional 200 tons. He also mentioned that this year we may have to have two street sweeping clean-ups due to all the grits on the road. Mayor Marino asked that Mr. Schneider have the contract in by the April meeting for approval.

Councilman Sena thanked the Road Dept. for the great job they did in keeping the roads clean during the winter months.

Motion by Councilman Sena, seconded by Councilman Garrett to close to Mike Schneider. All in favor.

**3. BOARD OF HEALTH**

The next meeting will be held on April 18<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 PM and one more member is needed for a full board.

**PUBLIC PORTION:**

Motion by Councilman Krasnomowitz, seconded by Councilman Kelly to open the meeting to the public for any questions or comments they might have with regard to the good and welfare with the Borough. All in favor.

Ann Smulewicz – Wantage – Ms. Smulewicz owns property in Hamburg and has a complaint about being treated rudely by an employee when she wanted to get a tax information. She also wondered why she was not able to receive a print out of a tax duplicate. She complimented the Council also for the terrific job they do for Hamburg.

Joseph Ferrara – 29 Hamilton Street – discussed with the Council his reoccurring problem with snow removal on his property and has filed a Police complaint on 2/11 and 2/17. Each year this causes him undue anxiety and he is disabled and does not need any additional problems. He stated that a water valve has been damaged, along with a light pole and curbing. What he is asking is that the Road Dept., when they plow the “cul-de-sac”, to please do parallel plowing and not perpendicular plowing as they do now. The perpendicular pushes the snow, grit and gravel onto his grass up to 15’ in, which not only damages his grass and shrubs, but makes it difficult to clean up in the summer. This would also alleviate the huge amounts of snow piled on his property.

Councilman Sena asked if he had more snow than the other residents and Mr. Ferrara answered yes and to please ride past his home to see. Mayor Marino asked him what he wanted the Road Dept. to do with the snow and he answered to not put it on his lawn and to spread it out evenly by doing the parallel snowing.

Karen Ferrara – 33 Hamilton Street – stated that she was also present about the snow plowing problem, saying that she has sent three letters to the Mayor and Council this year and one last year. This year Mr. Schneider blockaded her in, then came back and dug her out. She also has anxiety before a snow storm and is on disability. Ms. Ferrara said she feels the Road Dept. has a personal vendetta against her from 2011 until present. She has called 911 because she is concerned for her life and feels as she is being harassed. Ms. Ferrara showed the Council pictures she took from various snowstorms.

Ann Smulewicz – added that she could not imagine telling the State highway trucks to not plow by her property.

Motion by Councilman Garrett, seconded by Councilman Krasnomowitz to close to the public. All in favor.

Motion by Councilman Krasnomowitz, seconded by Councilman Kelly to enter into Executive Session at 8:55 PM. All in favor.


