Municipal Aid Grant 2015 – Notification that Hamburg has been awarded the 2015 Municipal Aid
Mayor Marino stated that Hamburg received the 2015 Municipal Aid Grant in the amount of \$120,000.00 and smaller roads as Jennings, Limekiln, and King Cole could be repaved if money were available.

Senior Citizen of the Year Award Recommendations

Mayor Marino stated that he has received recommendations Senior Citizens of the Year. Recreation Commission nominated Carol Jean Steffy for female senior citizen and submitted a list of her commendations. Councilman Barr recommended William Cunningham for male senior citizen of the year and submitted a list of his commendations.

Motion by Councilman Barr, seconded by Councilman Law to accept these recommendations for Senior Citizens of the Year for the Borough of Hamburg. All in favor.

Recreation Fields

Mayor Marino informed Mike Schneider that, due to the wet weather, he could open the park at his discretion anytime in April.

Councilman Barr asked if we were selling advertising and Councilman Law replied that we do not as it

would be the Little League that would be the ones to do it and profit from it. Councilman Barr discussed that it should be allowed so that they could make money.

Motion by Councilman Barr, seconded by Councilman Law to allow Little League to sell advertising banners as a fundraiser of the banners. All in favor.

Councilman Law also brought to the Council's attention the need for the plastic tubing around the baseball fence. This would cost approximately \$800.00, is a safety issue, and would recommend doing so.

Motion by Councilman Law, seconded by Councilman Barr to install the plastic tubing around the baseball fence at a cost of approximately \$800.00. All in favor.

Mayor Marino stated that the Littell Center is still the number to contact to schedule the fields. He would also like to get going on the playground. Councilman Barr has some books and is moving forward with it.

Monthly Report for March 2015

The March 2015 monthly report for the Police Department showed 519 calls of service, including 7 arrests, 14 motor vehicle accidents, and 87 motor vehicle summonses issued (ETickets – 87, hard copies – 0).

Director Yahm stated that some of the training the officers had to do spiked the overtime as it was on a timetable of the State and unable to be controlled. He also said that he applied for and received an ECivics grant in the amount of \$11,000.00 for portable radios. He will be giving more information on it but it took about two months to obtain. Councilman Barr commended Director Yahm and also Councilman Burd for making the ECivics available to the town.

Motion by Councilman Barr, seconded by Councilman Law to close to Director Yahm. All in favor.

Fire and EMS monthly reports

Fire Department Jaws of Life

Motion by Councilman Law, seconded by Councilman Barr to open to Fire Chief Bill Oehler. All in favor. Chief Oehler discussed the Jaws of Life that is needed in the department. The Jaws is \$10,820.50 but he would also want a 110 Volt adapter for approximately \$650.00.

Councilman Barr asked if he has looked for a grant for this and Mr. Oehler replied no he has not but also he has not be getting any email grants from Marguerite Nemeth lately either. Mayor Marino asked if this could be tabled until the May meeting and to take this time to look into grants. Councilman Law agreed to help with the search.

Motion by Councilman Law, seconded by Councilman Garrett to close to Bill Oehler. All in favor.

Correspondence from NJ State Police -- compliance with town EOP Plan.

Councilman Law stated that Keith Sukennikoff worked on the Emergency Operations Plan and is now in compliance with the State. All paperwork has been submitted and records updated. Councilman Law said Mr. Sukennikoff did a terrific job.

OEM -Mitigation Plan

Keith Sukennikoff attended meetings on the county level and upgraded the entire plan and submitted it to FEMA. He stated that if there were a disaster in town and this plan were not in place, we would not qualify for funding.

Councilman Barr mentioned to the Council that he received correspondence regarding a donation for the Survivors of the Seton Hall Fire, in which he would like to make a donation.

Motion by Councilman Barr, seconded by Councilman Law to make a donation in the amount of \$100.00 to the survivors of the Seton Hall Fire. All in favor.

Councilman Garrett stated the warranty on the clock is up and the Borough received a maintenance agreement. In speaking with Doreen Schott and Mike Schneider, two motors have been replaced out of warranty.

Mike Schneider reiterated that the two motors have been replaced and work has been performed on the clock. Councilman Krasnomowitz had concerns about #8 in the maintenance agreement and the charges. After discussion, motion by Councilman Garrett, seconded by Councilman Law to accept the Verdin Clock Maintenance Agreement for 2015 in the amount of \$580.00. All in favor.

Farmside Landscaping: Recreation Field Lawn Maintenance and Aeration-\$4865.00.

1. ROAD DEPARTMENT

Councilman Sena said the Road Dept. was going to trim the tree branches on Holly Drive as we are going to have the street sweeping starting soon. Leaf pickup will be on Monday and Friday with brush on Wednesday. They will also start to cold patch the roads.

Councilman Sena also said the Road Dept. this year never did run out of salt; we still have 125 ton on hand to start next year off. There were minor equipment issues and we only had a few resident complaints. Councilman Sena also did say the sidewalks on Rt.23 being snow covered were still an issue.

Councilman Sena said the town needed to perform an animal census of the town this year and said that Lisa Deutsch, who did the census two years ago, submitted a letter of intent for this year.

Councilman Sena informed the Council that Rec held a Family Fun Day at the YMCA that was attended by about 50-60 residents, very successful and everyone had a terrific time. A representative from the Sussex County Miners Baseball League attended to give a presentation about all the upcoming and new changes taking place at the stadium. Chris Fitzpatrick attended the presentation for putting together Sussex County Day. Summer Rec will be proceeding and will be held June 29th through July 10th as long as the signup numbers are there.


