ORDINANCE NO. 10-2026

ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF HAMBURG, COUNTY OF SUSSEX AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY SUPPLEMENTING AND AMENDING CHAPTER 164 OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF HAMBURG - SEWERS

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Hamburg, Sussex County, State of New Jersey, that Chapter 164 entitled “Sewers,” of the Code of the Borough of Hamburg is hereby supplemented and amended as follows:

Section I

The Code of the Borough of Hamburg, Section 164-69 entitled “Connection Charges,” shall be supplemented and amended as follows:

Pursuant to Section 164-69, shall reflect the following:

A municipal service connection charge shall be paid prior to any connection being made to the Borough's system and/or prior to the issuance of a certificate of occupancy. The service connection charge shall be determined by the Mayor and Council each year and shall be recomputed at the end of each budget year after a public hearing is held in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:26A-11. The developer(s) or owner(s) shall pay all charges and supply a paid SCMUA receipt to the collector's office before work commences.

Section II

Pursuant to Section 164-70, shall reflect the following:

When multiple users or enterprises exist within a single user, or on a single property, separate unit user charges shall be applied to each applicable type or use contained therein, as set forth in this schedule. The Borough reserves the right to modify the number of EDU's assigned to any user. Based on actual discharge volumes

Section III

All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistencies.

Section IV

If any article, section, subsection, paragraph, phrase or sentence is, for any reason, held to be unconstitutional or invalid, said article, section, subsection, paragraph, phrase or sentence shall be deemed severable.

Section V

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and any publication as may be required by law.
